Bad Moons Rising

A random sampling of children's books at a small local library reveals frequent errors in how moon phases are depicted. Below are excerpts from just a few of the books and brief descriptions of the stories. What do you see wrong with these pictures? (Click on the thumbnail image to enlarge.)

Compare your observations with <u>comments</u> about shortcomings and errors in the illustrations. With younger learners for whom this is too advanced, use the images to begin or to support dialog about the moon. Assume these scenes occur in northern mid-latitudes. See <u>More Faux Phases I</u> and <u>More Faux Phases II</u> for additional book excerpts.



Meanwhile, illustrator Clement Hurd keeps a keen eye toward astronomy and depicts the moons accurately in the classic children's book *Goodnight Moon* by Margaret Wise Brown, as shown at the <u>Good(night) Moons Rising</u> web page.

Make a Moon Finder to show the position of the moon for any given phase and time. The <u>poster</u> text accompanying these images is reprinted from the *GLPA Proceedings*, 1997, p. 161.
